



And it even sounds sort of like "Iko Iko"! After I bought the album, I listened to it a few times, taped it on the flipside of my new Timbuk I tape, and put it away. It sounded a lot like the "Little Creatures" album. However, the release of David Byrne's new movie of the same name is causing quite a stir in the media. Just to cite a few examples: Last night (10/20/86) I watched Max. Headroom interview Byrne, who seemed very nervous and somewhat bashful - he just couldn't look old Max in the eye. A couple of hours later, coming in the afternoon mail, was my boss' Rolling Stone, which included a review of the new movie, but it was not quite as complimentary as the Time article, to say the least.
